As readers we will:

- Enjoy reading for pleasure.
- Create a story map to help us retell the story.
- Use a thesaurus to help with descriptive language.
- Explore features of a recount text.

As writers we will:

- Box up structural features.
- Complete short burst writing tasks.
- Write a recount of event in the correct order.
- Plan and write a poem and mimic the style of the poem we use.

Science

As scientists we will:

- Learn how animals and living things can be sorted into groups.
- Understand and recognise the difference between vertebrates and invertebrates.
- Explore the characteristics of certain living things.
- Discuss how people can have a positive effect on the local environment.
- Look at endangered species.

Maths

As mathematicians we will:

- Represent numbers to 100.
- Explore tens and ones using addition.
- Be able to recognise place value up to 1000 on a number line and using place value charts.
- Find 1, 10, 100 more or less.
- Compare objects and numbers.
- Explore ordering numbers to 1000.
- Use counting sticks and other physical resources to be able to count in 50s.
- Add and subtract multiples of 100.
- Add and subtract 1s.
- Add and subtract 3-digit and 1-digit numbers—not crossing the 10 barrier.
- Add and subtract 2-digit and 1-digit numbers crossing the 10 barrier.
- Add 3 digit and 1 digit numbers - crossing the 10 barrier.
- Recall times tables 2s, 5s, 10s, 3s, 4s, 6s.

Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age

National Curriculum
lead subject: History

New knowledge we will acquire:

- In Britain, the Stone Age was around 12,000 years ago.
- Early hunter gatherers used a variation of tools we use now.
- Throughout the stone age there was a constant search for food which meant moving around, hunting and gathering.
- Farming arrived in Britain some 6,000 years ago, marking the beginning of the 'Neolithic Period' (New Stone Age).
- There were significant changes between hunter gatherers and early farmers such as tools they used.
- Skara Brae is a prehistoric village.

Learning activities we will complete:

- Use a timeline to place the events from the past in chronological order.
- Workshop to explore tools used in the Stone Age.
- Comparison tasks to compare the life of a hunter gatherer to how we get our food today.
- Research using various sources to see what an Early Neolithic Farm would look like and why it looks like it does.
- Create our own Early Neolithic Farm using a range of mediums.
- Read a Newspaper report to create a television advert about finding the new village 'Skara Brae.'
