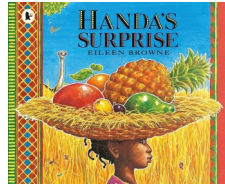

The Baker by the sea by Paula White

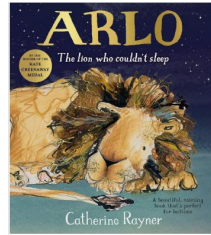


As readers we will:

As writers we will:

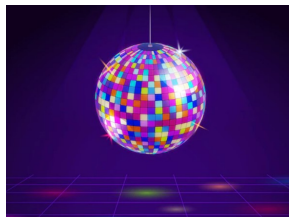
In familiar narratives, I can write a new scene in the story
