Year 3: Multiplication and Division

History- World War One, The Story of a Soldier

New knowledge we will acquire:

- WWI began in 1914 and ended in 1918.
- Countries involved were UK, France, Germany, Russia and Austria-Hungary.
- The Lucitania was a ship that was sunk in WWI.
- The Hull Pals were a group of men from Hull who fought in WWI in France. They fought in the battle of Oppy Wood.
- Life in the trenches was hard, some soldiers got trench foot.
- During the war, women took over many of the jobs men did before they were sent away to fight.
- 200 of the Hull Pals were killed in the battle of Oppy Wood and many more were missing.
- We remember people who died in WWI at Remembrance Day.

Learning activities we will complete:

- Share responses of our current understanding with our peers.
- Use a world map to locate and label the countries in the war.
- Using timelines to gain a sense of the time periods.
- Role play of the recruitment of soldiers.
- Design posters of the Lucitania tragedy.
- Create a fact file on a Hull soldier.
- Use different sources to gather a range of evidence.
- Design and build a model trench.
- Create a sequence of events that took place at Oppy Wood.
